Kansas Liability Law Sign – Where's Yours?

If you don't have a Kansas Liability Law sign posted on your property, **YOU ARE NOT COVERED** by the law. This statute protects you from frivolous law suits regarding horses, cattle, swine, sheep, goats, domesticated deer, llamas, poultry, rabbits, ponies, mules, jennys, donkeys or hinnys.

Does your fairground or arena have a WARNING sign posted? Why take a chance – take advantage of this protection today. \$30 for KHC members; \$40 for non-members. Merchandise amounts include tax and shipping. Delivery is within 7-10 days.

You may also buy signs at the KHC office in Manhattan for \$25 (members) or \$35 (non-members). Order them on the Kansas Horse Council website via PayPal or call the KHC office, 785-776-0662.

HIGH SCHOOL EQUESTRIAN ATHLETE PROGRAM

presented by the UNITED STATES EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION

Did you know that through USEF, all USEF members in Grades 9-12 can earn letterman patches and year pins?

Program requirements include:

- ◆ Log at least 100 hours of equestrian activity, including
 - ◇ Riding, lessons, lunging, vaulting, hacking, trail riding, ground training and more.
 - ◇ Doesn't include barn chores, grooming, stall cleaning, and more.
- ◆ Compete in at least 3 competitions
 - ◇ Includes USEF, AQHA, USEA, USDF, IEA, 4-H, FFA, Pony Club, competitions held by local clubs or associations, drill team competitions, rodeos, schooling shows, etc.
- ◆ The program costs \$15 per year, not including USEF membership. You can be a USEF Competing Junior Member or a Non-Competing Junior Member.
- ◆ The program year runs from June 1 through May 31. Any hours or competitions within the program year may be used, regardless of when you sign up for the program.
- ◆ You can apply for retroactive years so long as you are a current high school student and meet all other requirements.

This is a great opportunity to earn a letterman patch that no one else in your school may have, unless they are an USEF member. You can also get exclusive USEF High School Equestrian Athlete apparel.

AHA Frequent Rider Program (FRP)

The Frequent Rider Program rewards riders for every hour that they spend riding or driving an Arabian or Half-Arabian/Anglo-Arabian horse in non-competitive activities. You can earn your hours on a trail ride, participating in parades, taking lessons, training under saddle and more.

A one-time processing fee of \$25 is due when you sign up for the program and is good for the lifetime of the individual rider. You may ride any number of horses, as long as they are Arabians, Half-Arabian/Anglo-Arabians registered with the Arabian Horse Association.

Awards are based on the number of hours you ride or drive an eligible horse. Currently, awards include Lapel Pins, AHA T-shirts, AHA Hats, AHA Soft-sided Cooler and more. There is no time limit to reach these goals.
